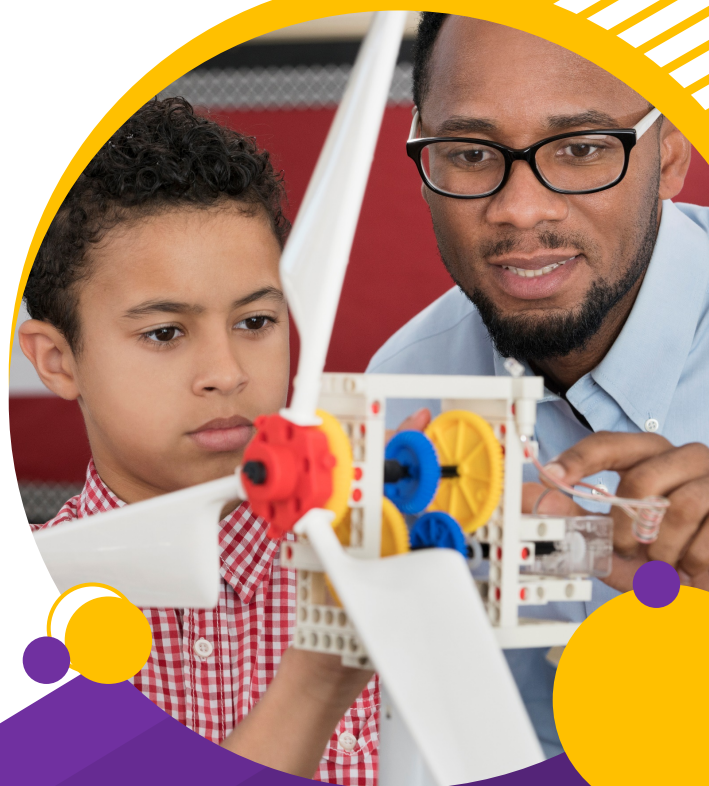

The Lack of Literacy in Adults

Approximately 32 million adults in the United States can't read according to the U.S. Department of Education and the National Institute of Literacy (Washington Post 2016)

The deficiency in adults not knowing how to read can be attributed to lack of schooling. Many adults come to the U.S. as immigrants and not afforded the time or money to attend school on a regular basis. Many of the adults have to find work to take care of their families. The children are sent to school with the hope they can somehow teach others as they become more proficient in the English language.
